Privatization Forces Seek Takeover of Mississippi Legislature

Mississippi voters face an election season that is increasingly flooded by out-of-state money, much of it coming from **school privatization backers attempting to defeat pro-public education candidates**. The lead actor in the onslaught, Empower MS, actively recruited pro-school choice candidates to run against pro-public school legislators in key Republican races. Empower MS PAC is funding the following Mississippi candidates using \$397,000 from the American Federation for Children (AFC), a national privatization organization that pushes for-profit charter schools and vouchers for private school tuition (see more below).
