House - 2025 Legislative Session

House Bill 1078 – ESA Vouchers. Removes provisions passed in the 2024 session that tightened restrictions and accountability in the ESA voucher statute. Removes cap on number of voucher participants. Expands program to include foster children who do not have special needs. Allows an unnamed nonprofit to receive state funds to administer the program.

The Parents' Campaign favors a vote of nay on this bill.
