House - 2025 Legislative Session

House Bill 1902 – Private School Funding. Provides public funding for private schools of \$20-million in 2025 (an increase of \$11-million over current law) and annually thereafter via Children’s Promise Act tax credits. Each participating private school can receive up to \$600,000 in publicly-funded revenue annually, with no restrictions on expenditure of funds, no reporting requirements, and no state audit to verify the number of qualifying children enrolled.

The Parents’ Campaign favors a vote of nay on this bill.
