House - 2025 Legislative Session

House Bill 1903 – Private School Funding. Provides public funding for private schools of \$16-million in 2025, \$18-million in 2026, and \$20-million in 2027 (significant increases over current law) and annually thereafter via Children’s Promise Act tax credits. Each participating private school can receive up to \$480,000 in 2025, \$540,000 in 2026, and \$600,000 annually by 2027, with no restrictions on expenditure of funds, no reporting requirements, and no state audit to verify the number of qualifying children enrolled.

The Parents’ Campaign favors a vote of nay on this bill.
